



BACKGROUND

Sudan has faced over **eight months of violent conflict** following the outbreak of hostilities between **the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF)** in April 2023. This conflict has caused the largest displacement and protection crisis globally, affecting **almost 25 million people who now require humanitarian aid.**

The collapse of infrastructure, including water supplies, healthcare, banking services, electricity, and telecommunications, has intensified the crisis. 70% of health facilities in conflict-affected areas are non-functional, leaving the remaining ones overwhelmed. This situation has exacerbated food insecurity for displaced families in Kassala, many of whom have limited or no access to basic necessities.

This project aimed to enhance food security among the most vulnerable internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Kassala by providing essential food baskets to those in need.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES & OUTPUTS



1. COORDINATION WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES

- Collaborated with community leaders and local authorities to identify and verify 185 of the most vulnerable families in IDP shelters.
- Ensured no duplication of assistance with other humanitarian efforts.

2. MARKET ASSESSMENT <

- conducted a market assessment to determine the availability and cost of essential food items.
- Evaluated logistical requirements to ensure timely and efficient distribution.





4. BENEFICIARY SELECTION & REGISTRATION

- Families were selected based on the following criteria:
- Women-headed households
- Households with disabled members
- Households with elderly members
- Low-income households
- Large households (more than 5 members)
- Households with pregnant women or infants

3. PROCUREMENT OF **FOOD BASKETS**

- Contracted a local supplier to purchase food items meeting nutritional and quality standards.
- Items included in each food basket:
- 5 kg sugar
- 5 kg lentils
- 2 liters sunflower oil
- 10 kg flour
- 5 kg rice



5. DISTRIBUTION PLAN

 A distribution schedule was developed in advance to avoid crowding and ensure an efficient process.

 Beneficiaries were notified through multiple communication channels about their designated collection times.





6. DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD BASKETS



- 185 food baskets were distributed, directly benefiting 925 individuals.
- Each household received a full food packag to support their nutritional needs.

PROJECT IMPACT

> 925 INDIVIDUALS 185 displaced families (925 individuals) received essential food supplies, improving their food security.

Reduction in hunger and malnutrition among the most vulnerable IDP households.

REDUCTION IN HUNGER AND MALNUTRITION

STRENGTHENED RESILIENCE

Strengthened resilience of affected families by ensuring access to staple foods.

Improved coordination between humanitarian actors and local community leaders for effective aid delivery. IMPROVED COORDINATION

One widowed mother of three, displaced due to conflict, shared how receiving a food basket allowed her to provide nutritious meals for her children for the first time in weeks, alleviating some of the hardship her family endured.



SUSTAINING HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS

Humanity-Increased remains committed to supporting Sudanese families affected by conflict. Future efforts will focus on:

- Expanding food distribution programs to reach more displaced families.
- Exploring sustainable food assistance models, including community-driven meal programs.
- Advocating for increased support and resources to prevent further deterioration of food security in Sudan.
