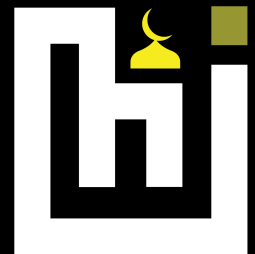




# EMERGENCY FLOOD RELIEF IN BANGLADESH

# BACKGROUND

**Organization:** Humanity-Increased

**Project Name:** Emergency Relief for Flood Victims in Bangladesh

**Project Location:** Feni, Cumilla, Noakhali, Laxmipur, Habiganj, Moulvibazar, Chittagong, Khagrachari

**Project Start Date:** August 24, 2024

**Project End Date:** October 24, 2024

**Number of Beneficiaries:** 2,485 individuals (497 households)

In mid-2024, torrential monsoon rains and the sudden release of water from upstream Indian dams caused severe flooding across southeastern Bangladesh. Homes, farmland, and roads were submerged, displacing thousands. Many families found themselves without food, clean water, or shelter.

In response, Humanity-Increased responded with lifesaving aid. This emergency intervention focused on immediate survival needs—cooked meals, dry food rations, hygiene kits, and water—targeting the most affected and vulnerable populations.

# PROJECT ACTIVITIES & OUTPUTS

## 1. COORDINATION WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES <

Humanity-Increased teams worked with local leaders, civil authorities, and community volunteers to identify the most vulnerable families and ensure aid reached those in greatest need without duplication.



## 2. NEEDS ASSESSMENT & SITE PREPARATION <

- Rapid assessments were conducted in shelters and remote areas. Targeted interventions were planned for families who had no access to basic services or emergency relief.







## 4. BENEFICIARY SELECTION & REGISTRATION

- Priority was given to:
- Women-headed households
- Elderly and disabled individuals
- Low-income families
- Displaced families without aid access

## 3. PROCUREMENT & QUALITY CONTROL

All food and hygiene materials were sourced locally to ensure timely delivery. Strict procurement and inspection procedures were followed to maintain quality and compliance.

### Aid distributed included:

- **Cooked Meals:** 1,485 hot meals for immediate consumption
- **Dry Ration Kits:** 100 households received 15-day food packs
- **Hygiene Kits:** 100 families supported with essentials for sanitation and disease prevention





## 5. DISTRIBUTION PLAN



A structured distribution schedule was implemented to avoid overcrowding and ensure efficient, dignified delivery. Volunteers provided both on-site and door-to-door distribution in remote flood zones.



## 6. MONITORING & DOCUMENTATION



Humanity-Increased maintained strict oversight of all stages of the project. Financial tracking, photographic records, and real-time reporting were conducted to ensure accountability and transparency.
