



BACKGROUND

Organization: Humanity-Increased

Project Name: Qurbani 2025 – Pakistan

Number of Beneficiaries: 150 households (1,000 individuals)

Across the urban slums of Rawalpindi and Islamabad, thousands of low-income families face chronic food insecurity, malnutrition, and social marginalization. During Eid al-Adha—a time meant for sharing and celebration—these families often go without, unable to afford the cost of sacrificial meat.

In 2025, Humanity-Increased launched a targeted Qurbani intervention to ensure that the spiritual and nutritional blessings of Eid reached those most in need. This project provided high-quality, ethically slaughtered Qurbani meat to 150 vulnerable families living in extreme poverty, fulfilling both religious obligations and humanitarian priorities.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES & **OUTPUTS**



2.PROCUREMENT & RELIGIOUS **COMPLIANCE**

Five healthy animals were procured and vetted for compliance with Islamic Qurbani standards. The slaughter was conducted during the days of Eid in halal-certified facilities, under supervision to ensure religious and hygienic integrity.

1.COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT & < **BENEFICIARY SELECTION**

Local field teams assessed eligible households in May 2025 based on:

- Income level (zero or very low)
- Household size and structure
- Female-headed or orphansupported homes
- Vulnerability (elderly, disabled, or displaced)

A transparent scoring system ensured aid was delivered to the most deserving with dignity.







3.MEAT PROCESSING & DISTRIBUTION



- Meat was cleaned, cut, and packed into 3 kg portions.
- Distribution was carried out in an orderly manner across the slum areas.
- Total meat distributed:
 Approximately 500-550 kg.

 All 150 families received meat on the days of Eid.

4. DISTRIBUTION STRATEGY



The meat was divided into 3-kilogram portions, packaged, and distributed the same day to ensure freshness and alignment with Eid observance. A total of 525 kilograms of meat was delivered across the two districts.
