BACKGROUND

Organization: Humanity-Increased

Project Name: Qurbani Project 2026

Project Location: Somalia, Kenya, Syria, Sudan, Gaza (Palestine), Uganda, Yemen, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Rohingya Refugee Camps in Bangladesh, and Uyghur Refugee Communities in Türkiye

Project Start Date: May 1, 2026

Project End Date: September 30, 2026

Total Beneficiaries: 6600 households per day (approximately 32408 individuals daily)

Eid al-Adha is a key Islamic occasion commemorating Prophet Ibrahim's sacrifice. Muslims perform Qurbani, sacrificing livestock and distributing meat to family, neighbors, and those in need; for many vulnerable families, this is their only chance for fresh meat. Humanity-Increased launched its 2026 Global Qurbani Project in twelve humanitarian contexts affected by conflict and hardship, focusing on vulnerable groups like widows, orphans, and the elderly. Fresh meat was distributed where feasible, while frozen and canned meat was provided to beneficiaries in conflict zones like Syria and Gaza.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES & OUTPUTS



1. NEEDS ASSESSMENT & BENEFICIARY IDENTIFICATION

Field teams collaborated with local partners and leaders to identify vulnerable households using selection criteria that prioritized:

- Widows and female-headed households
- Orphans
- Internally displaced persons
- Refugees
- Elderly individuals living alone
- Persons with disabilities
- Low-income families
- Households facing severe food insecurity

Beneficiary lists were verified to ensure assistance reached those in greatest need.

2. PROCUREMENT OF QURBANI ANIMALS

Animals were sourced locally from qualified vendors following Islamic and veterinary standards. The procurement process included:

- Healthy Qurbani animals
- Veterinary inspections
- Local livestock sourcing
- Transportation to approved slaughter facilities
- Quality checks before slaughter

This approach supported local farmers and economies in project countries.

3.SLAUGHTERING, PROCESSING & PACKAGING



All Qurbani sacrifices were conducted during Eid al-Adha following Islamic principles, which included:

- Veterinary inspection
- Islamic slaughter procedures
- Hygienic meat processing
- Portioning into family-sized packages
- Safe packaging
- Cold-chain storage
- Transportation to distribution locations

Fresh meat was distributed in Somalia, Kenya, Sudan, Uganda, Yemen, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Rohingya refugee camps, and Türkiye. Frozen meat was prepared for Syria, and canned Qurbani meat was produced for Gaza to bypass border restrictions.



4. QURBANI DISTRIBUTION



Following slaughter and packaging, meat distributions were carried out across all project locations.

Project distributions included:

- Somalia – 21 cattle distributed to **840 households (4,200 individuals)**
- Kenya – 15 cattle distributed to **600 households (3,000 individuals)**
- Sudan – 12 cattle distributed to **402 households (2,170 individuals)**
- Uganda – 8 cattle distributed to **211 households (1,055 individuals)**
- Yemen – 65 goats distributed to **260 households (1,040 individuals)**
- Pakistan – 15 cattle distributed to **467 households (2,989 individuals)**
- Afghanistan – Qurbani meat distributed to **244 households (1,464 individuals)**
- Bangladesh – Qurbani meat distributed to **280 households (1,120 individuals)**
- Rohingya Refugees (Bangladesh) – **Qurbani meat distributed to 280 households (1,120 individuals)**
- Uyghur Refugees (Türkiye) – **One cow distributed to 40 households (200 individuals)**
- Syria – Frozen Qurbani meat prepared for **360 households (1,800 individuals)**
- Gaza – Canned Qurbani meat prepared for **450 households (2,250 individuals)**

Distributions were conducted in an organized and dignified manner to ensure equitable access for vulnerable families.

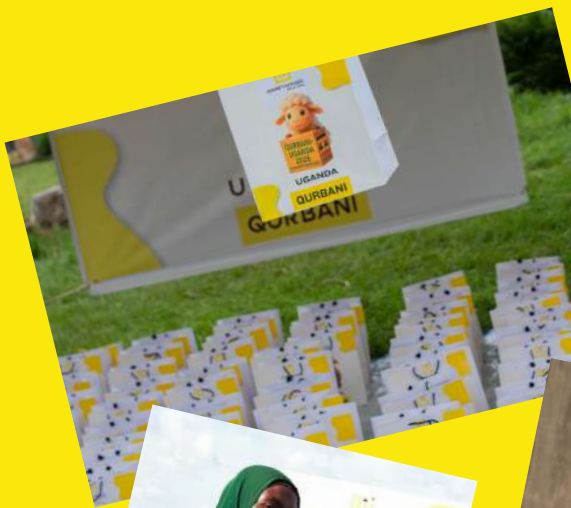


SUSTAINING HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS
