BACKGROUND

Organization: Humanity-Increased

Project Name: Bangladesh New Homes for Flood Victims

Project Location: Sonagazi Sadar, Feni District, Chittagong Division, Bangladesh

Project Start Date: November 15, 2022

Project End Date: February 15, 2026

Total Beneficiaries: 05 households (approximately 25 individuals)

The devastating floods that struck Feni District in 2024 destroyed thousands of homes and displaced countless families.

Heavy rainfall and upstream flooding swept through villages, washing away homes, damaging livelihoods, and leaving many families living in temporary shelters constructed from tarps, damaged tin sheets, and salvaged materials. Even months after the disaster, many flood survivors remained without permanent housing and continued to face the risk of future flooding.

To help families rebuild their lives, Humanity-Increased launched the Bangladesh New Homes for Flood Victims project. The initiative provided permanent tin-shed homes for the most vulnerable flood-affected families, restoring safety, dignity, and stability while helping communities begin their long-term recovery.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES & OUTPUTS



2. PROCUREMENT OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

Construction materials were acquired following established procedures to guarantee quality and durability, including:

- Bricks
- Cement
- Sand
- Reinforced structural materials
- Corrugated tin roofing and wall panels
- Doors and windows
- Other essential supplies

1. NEEDS ASSESSMENT & BENEFICIARY IDENTIFICATION

Field teams conducted community assessments in collaboration with local leaders to identify families whose homes had been completely destroyed during the floods. Selection criteria prioritized:

- Families whose homes were completely washed away
- Female-headed households
- Families with limited or no income
- Households unable to rebuild without assistance
- Families living in temporary or unsafe shelters





3.CONSTRUCTION OF NEW HOMES



Each home was built with a standardized flood-resilient design for the local environment.

Construction activities included:

- Site preparation and leveling
- Foundation construction
- Structural framing
- Installation of walls and roofing
- Door and window installation
- Interior finishing
- Final inspections

Each completed home included:

- Two bedrooms
- Kitchen area
- Toilet facility
- Front veranda

4. HOUSE HANDOVER



All five homes were inspected for quality before being handed over to families.

The handover process ensured:

- Verification of completed construction
- Beneficiary acceptance
- Final documentation
- Safe occupancy of each home

Families immediately transitioned from temporary shelters into permanent housing designed to better withstand future flooding.
